KINGDOM CAUSE FOR SEPTEMBER MODERN DAY SLAVERY

Partner Agency - International Justice Mission

Modern-day slavery is the exploitation of people through force, fraud, or coercion for labor or sex, trapping them in situations they cannot leave. Despite being illegal worldwide, modern slavery affects an estimated **50 million people** globally, spanning industries like agriculture, construction, domestic work, and the commercial sex trade.

International Justice Mission (IJM) is a global, non-governmental organization dedicated to protecting people living in poverty from violence. Operating through 33 program offices in 19 countries, IJM collaborates with local authorities such as police, judicial systems, and community leaders to combat human trafficking, modern slavery, violence against women and children, and police abuse of power.

IJM's mission centers on four core actions: rescuing victims from violent circumstances, bringing criminals to justice, restoring survivors to safety and strength, and strengthening justice systems to create lasting protection. Through these efforts, IJM aims to build sustainable, safer communities where justice for poor and vulnerable populations becomes unstoppable.
