September's Kingdom Cause: Modern Day Slavery

International Justice Mission is a global organization that protects people in poverty from violence. They partner with local authorities in 18 countries to combat trafficking and slavery, violence against women and children, and police abuse of power.

Violence affects millions of women and children around the world. Those living in poverty are some of the most vulnerable to a range of everyday forms of violence—including sexual violence and domestic violence. When a man assaults his wife or partner, it's seen as a "family matter" handled inside the home instead of reported to authorities. Sexual violence against children is frequent, and courts are ill-equipped to handle these cases and can't respond when these women and children desperately need protection. Nearly 1 in 5 girls is sexually abused at least once in her life. Nearly 736 million women have experienced physical and/or sexual violence at least once in their lifetime. Worldwide, up to 50% of sexual assaults are committed against girls under 16 years old.

IJM helps restore survivors of violence, builds justice system capacity to identify and restrain offenders, and assists local authorities' efforts to prosecute and hold them accountable. Their goal is to prevent violence from happening in the first place. That's why IJM and their partners pursue sustainable improvements in local justice systems and build communities where all people can expect to be safe and protected.
